INSURANCE RENEWAL: Larry Hand from Associated Insurance Counselors & Real Estate, presented the Mayor and Council with the insurance renewal for the City. Hand went on to explain that there is an increase in property values which has increased the premium amount. Liability insurance has also increased. Hand provided options for increases in deductible amounts, which would cut back on the premium cost. There was discussion and the savings isn't significant enough to make a decision tonight. Since two members of Council absent the possibility of increasing deductibles will be discussed at the next meeting to allow for more input. A motion was made by M. Gerardy to approve the annual insurance renewal as presented. A. Reuter seconded the motion. Motion carried.

APPROVAL PAYMENT NO. 4 TO GANSEN EXCAVATING INC.: M. Gerardy made a motion to approve Payment No. 4, Final Retainage in the amount of \$9,841.03 to Gansen Excavating. R. Petersen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING: A. Reuter made a motion to set the Public Hearing for the 2023-2024 Budget for 6pm on April 24, 2023. M. Gerardy seconded the motion. Motion carried.

BUILDING PERMIT FOR MATT AND ERIN KLEMME (DELBERT AND DIANE KLEMME): Weinschenk stated that the site has been reviewed by David Michel and the permit meets the building setbacks. M. Gerardy

made a motion to approve the building permit for Delbert and Diane Klemme. R. Petersen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

BUILDING PERMIT FOR RAYMOND AND REBECCA WANZEK: Weinschenk stated that the site has been measured out and the setbacks are correctly staked out per David Michel. A. Reuter made a motion to approve the building permit for Raymond and Rebecca Wanzek. M. Gerardy seconded the motion.

Motion carried.

OTHER BUSINESS: Weinschenk informed Mayor and Council that an application for Asbestos Inspection has been submitted for the Treasure Trove on behalf of the City. This is through ECIA and there is no cost. Weinschenk showed Mayor and Council the design for the new Preston entrance signs to replace the wood Welcome to Preston signs. Council is wondering if the signs can by 5'x10'? Also, instead of metal poles could it be connected in stone? Weinschenk will check into these two items. Tim Morehead, Water/Sewer Superintendent, received a quote from Mississippi Valley Pump, for repairing the old pump so it is in working order as a spare. The quote is for \$2,842.00. Mayor and Council agree on repairing the old pump. Chief Miller tested three noncertified officers on Saturday, April 8<sup>th</sup>. One candidate passed. Interviews will take place on Tuesday, April 11<sup>th</sup>. The Ford squad car is going to Andrew to get the new radio system installed tomorrow (4/11).

With no other business, Mayor Sieverding asked for motion to adjourn. Motion to adjourn was made by M. Gerardy, seconded by A. Reuter. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 6:27 PM.
